**Did you know that research shows ALL students can benefit from inclusive practices?**



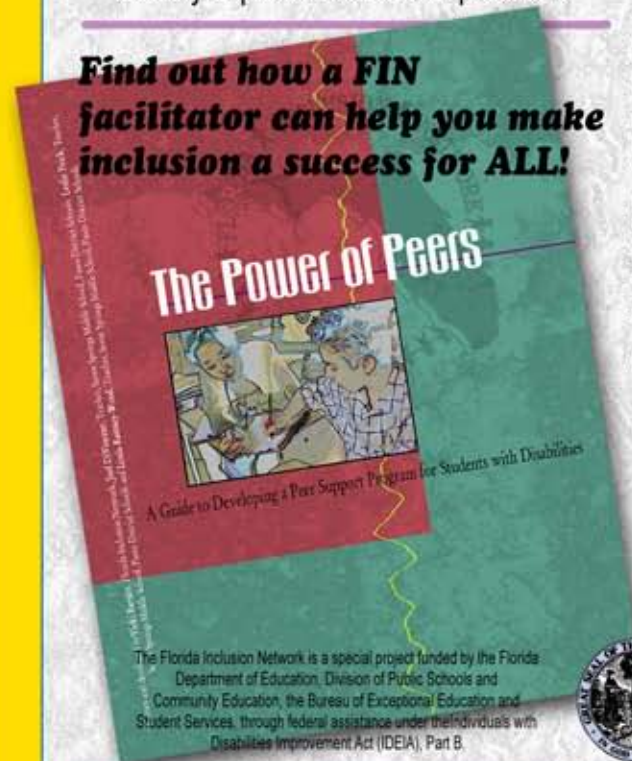
**The Florida Inclusion Network can bring research-based practices and practical strategies to your district and school.**
